Manufacturing is the production of goods from the beginnings as raw materials to after sales services. Manufacturing today is usually high-tech production on a large scale. Most manufacturing processes are automated to ensure products meet quality standards and can be produced in large volumes to meet demand. Advanced manufacturing involves the use of technology to improve products and processes.

# Did you Know?

- The Manufacturing Sector accounts for 22% of the region's workforce, employing over 80,000 people
- Yorkshire & the Humber is the country's largest food producing region
- Manufacturing of Chemicals and pharmaceuticals is prominent in the Humber

### Will there be opportunities available?

- Manufacturing supports young people; 66% of manufacturers plan to recruit an engineering apprentice in the next 12 months.
- Manufacturing is creating high-skilled jobs; the sector needs 750,000 science, technology and engineering professionals to replace those leaving the industry.
- The manufacturing sector has adopted new technologies and provided new jobs for workers. The industry is now experiencing exciting and exponential change, as technologies such as artificial intelligence (AI), robotics, and Internet of Things (IoT) are rapidly changing the workplace. While some predicted that these new technologies would eliminate jobs, the reverse has happened more jobs are being created.



### What is an Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeships are an excellent way of gaining qualifications and workplace experience. As an employee, you can earn as you learn and you gain practical skills from the workplace. There are up to 25,000 quality apprenticeship vacancies available at any one time here in the UK, with hundreds of these being in the Humber region. And, did you know also that there are apprenticeships in more than 280 industries and 1500 job roles, from graphic design to nursing?

### How will I do the training part if I'm working?

Every apprenticeship is different but two phrases that you'll hear mentioned a lot are: on-the-job training and off-the-job training.

On-the-job training will see you learn in the workplace. You'll be developing your skills by working with colleagues who will show you how to carry out certain tasks – either in formal, structured sessions or informal and unplanned learning.

Off-the-job training will allow you to learn and develop your skills and knowledge away from your immediate place of work. You might need to access a computer to do some online learning or maybe go to a training centre where you will learn in a classroom or workshop.

### Why should I become an apprentice?

Helping you gain all the skills you need to succeed in your career, an apprenticeship gives you real insight into your chosen industry – and you'll get paid!

Did you know that fantastic employers across the UK and in the Humber region are looking for candidates like you to take on an apprenticeship? There are up to 28,000 online vacancies at any one time – and apprenticeships are available in up to 1500 job roles. And when you consider that 90% of apprentices remain in employment and almost 20% progress to higher level of training and education, it's looking like a pretty tempting prospect, isn't it?

- •You work in a real job for a real employer
- •You are paid a salary and have a contract of employment
- •You achieve an apprenticeship recognised by employers

#### What makes a good apprentice?

Being an apprentice is the same as working as an employee in a business. There are different skills and attributes that each company will be looking for in candidates which will also be linked to job role. ### National Minimum Wage Update

The hourly rate for the minimum wage depends on your age and whether you're an apprentice.

You must be at least:

- <u>school leaving age</u> to get the National Minimum wage
- aged 25 to get the National Living Wage – the minimum wage will still apply for workers aged 24 and under

### **Current rates:**

25 & over	£8.72
21-24	£8.20
18-20	£6.45
Under 18	£4.55
Apprentice	£4.15

### **Apprentices**

<u>Apprentices</u> are entitled to the apprentice rate if they're either:

- aged under 19
- aged 19 or over and in the first year of their apprenticeship

Apprentices are entitled to the minimum wage for their age if they both:

- are aged 19 or over
- have completed the first year of their apprenticeship

# Top tips for creating your CV



An interview is a chance for an employer to see if you're the right person for the job. It's your chance to make a good impression and show what you have to offer. You can also use it to help you decide if the job and the company are right for you.

There are different types of interviews, including:


face-to-face with one person

- panel interview face-to-face, with 2 or more people and can include a presentation
- telephone This can be the first stage in recruitment and used when there are a lot of applicants
- Assessment Centre -- An assessment centre (or assessment day) is a combination of tasks and activities that test your suitability for the job. You'll have the chance to demonstrate a wider range of skills than you would have been able to during a traditional face-to-face interview.
- online interview you're interviewed online, using an application like Microsoft teams or Zoom

### Interview questions

Employers use different types of questions when interviewing. They can include:

- competency-based the focus is on the things you can do, so you'll be asked to give examples to show you have the skills needed for the job
- strengths-based these explore what you enjoy doing or do well and is used to check things like your practical or team working skills, or how you work under pressure
- technical for jobs in science, IT, engineering, finance or law they test your job-related knowledge and understanding of work processes
- situational judgement test how you would react in typical work situations and check things like your ability to solve problems, make decisions or work with others
- values-based commonly used for health and care jobs, particularly in the NHS, to confirm that you share the values and understand the culture of the organisation
- motivational these help an employer to see what drives you and to make sure you'll fit in with their company
