

#### Pastoral Support

- The Y11 Pastoral team comprises of Mr R. Watson (Head of Year) and Mrs J. Barker (Assistant Year Leader).
- We are the main point of contact for Year 11 queries and issues and are extremely privileged to oversee your child's journey in Y11 and offer support at this crucial period in their studies.
- We passionately believe in dealing with small issues before they become big issues (Y11 is a daunting time!), so we would urge you to not to hesitate to contact us whenever needed.



## What happens during 'form time'?

- From the start of this term, we have altered the form schedule to allow maximum intervention opportunity, tailored to your child's areas of need.
- Tuesday to Thursday sessions comprise of specific tailored intervention with specialists. The subjects your child attends will rotate each half-term in order of need.
- Friday is a weekly Assembly with the Y11 Pastoral team or SLT, we focus on achievements, core values and a theme for the week. We have a number of FE providers and employers also delivering assemblies in this time.



#### What support do we offer?

- Whilst we have incredibly high expectations of our year group, in line with the Academy's high levels of challenge, we also aim to offer extremely high levels of support.
- As well as dealing with behavioural and peer issues, we are also on hand to assist with student progress in lessons, careers, support for difficulties in student's personal lives or to offer general advice and guidance.
