Gold for Mrs Pharaoh

Champion bowler Amy Pharaoh has added another gold medal to her collection after winning the women's singles title at the European Championships.

Waltham Toll Bar Academy's Head of PE was also part of the women's triples team that won bronze at the same tournament in Ayr, Scotland.

The England ladies' captain was delighted by her singles triumph. "I was actually lucky to get out of the group stage as I lost a couple of games," she said. "But other results went my way so I got through to the play-offs for a chance to make the semi-finals."

She beat Lindsey Greechan from Jersey in the final 21-6. "I'd actually lost to her in the group stages and I was determined I wouldn't let it happen again," she said.



"It's my first gold medal at a major tournament in the singles. I played singles in the last Commonwealth Games – when I won silver in the doubles - but did not qualify out of the group.

"It was a chance for me to prove to myself I could still play singles and not be carried by anyone else!" She then competed in the triples with Ruby Hill, also from Lincolnshire, and Warwickshire's Emily Kernick.

They had a disappointing defeat to Wales in the semi-finals, pulling the game back from 17-3 down to level at 17-17. But they lost the final game on the last bowl.

They recovered to beat Ireland 24-12 in the bronze medal match. "I'm still feeling the defeat against Wales. It coming as it did after the gold medal, it's that game that sticks in the mind. It was such a disappointing way to lose, especially having fought our way back.

"But that's sport."

She thanked Principal Nigel Whittle for his continued support. "The Academy's once again been fantastic and I am grateful to the Principal and colleagues."

Mr Whittle congratulated Amy on her Scottish triumph. "We're proud to have a sports champion on our staff," he said. "Mrs Pharaoh's an inspiration to our students, particularly those studying PE at GCSE and A-level.

"To win in such circumstances shows the sort of resilience and determination we instil in our students. To be a champion takes a special kind of person."





Winning Performances



Congratulations to two Year 9s on fabulous, winning performances.

Dancer Sofia Reeves came first as part of a classical trio in an all England competition held in Wolverhampton while kickboxer Myles Johnston won gold at an event in Scunthorpe.

Sofia, who also came second at the national event in modern solo, has attended the Royal Ballet School in Newcastle for six years, travelling north every Saturday.

She said: "'It was a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

"Everyone was extremely proud of us. In the future, I'd either like to continue with the Royal Ballet Company or pursue a career on Broadway."

She has been in a dancing company since the age of three but it has been part of her life since she was one.

Sofia goes to at least one competition a month and, overall, has won 56 gold medals.

Co-director of Arts Mrs Carter said: "We're incredibly proud of Sofia's achievements and are lucky to have such a talented dancer at the academy.

"She's an inspiration to others, showing the dedication and work ethic needed to reach the top."

Myles has been kickboxing since he was 10 and this was his first gold medal.

He said: "This is a big achievement for me, something that can take my kickboxing career to another level."

He was congratulated by head of PE, Mrs Pharaoh. She said: "This is a fabulous achievement for Myles to win his first gold medal at a regional level.

"He's a determined character and I'm sure this will give him the encouragement needed to pursue his ambitions in the sport."

The EHC Hub is a website which provides a secure, shared area for the key individuals involved with a child or young person to make their contribution, see the contributions of others and all work towards a positive outcome. It also provides the opportunity to access information at any point in the EHC process, at any time of the day.
