It might be the end of the term (and year) but the plethora of opportunities given to students have continued to be unrelenting.

I reflected on the staff team's collective achievements at an end-of-term get together.

I recalled one of my walks around school last week.

On that day there was a trip to Rome; a visit to the Northern School of Contemporary Dance in Leeds; the Year 11 boys' football team playing in a cup final; trials in badminton and swimming; mentoring specialists Inner Drive working with Year 11s and their families; Year 6 pupils from Waltham Leas on a visit; and rehearsals for our big production of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.

It provided a snapshot of what we are working to achieve. On the same day, the validated results from the summer were published, with the academy comparing favourably with others locally.

We had the second highest percentage (42.9%) of Year 11 achieve grade 5 or above in English and Maths, 10% above the local authority average.

The academy topped the table for positive destinations, with 98% of our large cohort going on to further education, securing an apprentice-ship or gaining employment.

These statistics are a credit to those Year 11s and their families and staff team who have supported them.

The second Year 11 Maximise evening was very well attended.

Inner Drive gave sessions to families explaining their work with the students around motivation, resilience and organising time ahead of mocks and GCSEs next year.

I saw another perfect example demonstrating our efforts around aspiration in the Sixth Form College this week.

There, a good-sized group of Year 11s gave up time over lunch to attend a webinar by an adviser from the University of Cambridge. It came about because of the numbers of Year 10 and 11s attending an initial session in the lecture theatre.

The university's representatives were so impressed by the numbers and questions they offered the exclusive webinar.

It was a pleasure to invite a representative group to my office to hear their feedback.

Ilyn, Matthew and Martha were a credit to their year group. Focused on their studies, they were also clear about their future paths.

The live stream, in which they asked questions, had been invaluable and, in one case, had meant an immediate change of heart in terms of potential A-levels. Thank you to Mrs Clorley for organising what had clearly been an inspirational session.

Elsewhere, congratulations to those Year 8s and 9s who finished first and second out of 60 teams from across the Humber, Yorkshire and the Midlands in one round of a live, online Christmas Quiz hosted by the Advanced Mathematics Support Programme.
