

## A Battlefields Trip to *Remember*

Our Year 12 and 13 history students have recently returned from a study tour of the Belgian Battlefields. The trip, over four days, added real depth and resonance to their study of international relations in the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.

Over 30 students travelled to France and Belgium, taking in a range of sites and learning from professional guides at locations including: Lijssenthoek British Cemetery; Essex Farm Cemetery and Dressing Station; St Julien Canadian Memorial; Langemark German Cemetery; Lochnagar Crater, Vimy Ridge and the Menin Gate. They also visited the Thiepval Memorial and Visitors' Centre, Sanctuary Wood (Hill 62 Museum), the Cambrai Tank Museum and Citadel New Military Cemetery.

Not only have the students come away with a better understanding of the scale and tragedy of the WW1 battlefields, they left an impression on their hosts and teachers, who praised them for their maturity, dignity and academic inquisitiveness. We are very proud of them all.

Year 12 geography students were out in the field last week, visiting York to hone their data collection skills.

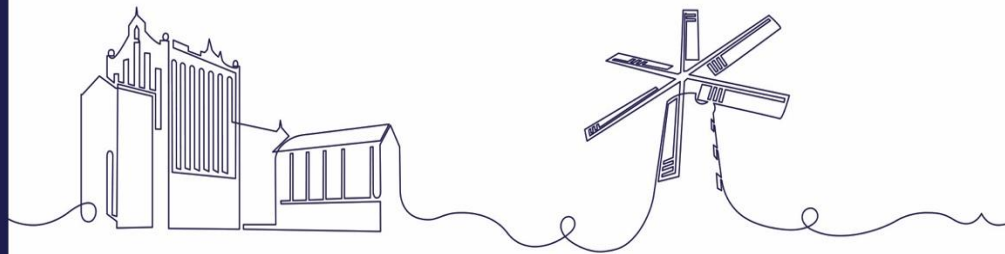
The day, in the heart of the City of York, was spent collecting data to investigate the urban structure of its central business district
